The World Education Congress honoured us with the Skill Development Leadership Award 2025; the Asia Pacific HRM Congress recognised us as Asia's Best Educational Institution. Education Today conferred the India School Merit Award, while The Academic Insights has named us as the Outstanding School of the

These accolades fill us with pride, but it is not the awards that define the **Neerja Modi Group of Schools**. It is our ethos — the unwavering belief that education must empower, enlighten, and enable young people to lead lives of meaning, purpose, and compassion that we hold on to.

At **Neerja Modi School**, we prepare our students for a dynamic, globalised future. Our academic programmes build a solid foundation, encouraging analytical thinking, curiosity, and research-based learning.

At the senior level, we focus on holistic education and international-mindedness & these values are reflected in our results year after year. This year, our high school students have once again proven that excellence is a habit at Neerja Modi School.

L & G, the CBSE Grade X and XII Board Examination results 2025 have been phenomenal and the **best in the City**.

In Grade X, Aryav Barmecha with 99.4% is AIR 4 and the school topper. Other top scorers include Vedant Kaul and Yash Agarwal, both at 99%. In aggregate performance, 40 students scored 97% and above, 70 students scored 95% and above, 177 students scored 90% and above, and 355 students secured overall distinction. Remarkably, 66 students scored a perfect 100 in various subjects.

In Grade XII, Deepshikha Prasad with 99.6% is AIR 2 and the school topper, and Sarvagya Tholia with 99.4% is AIR 3. Additionally, 27 students scored 97% and above, 56 students scored 95% and above, 152 students scored 90% and above, while 321 students secured overall distinction. An outstanding 122 students achieved a perfect 100 in various subjects.

The IB and IGCSE results this year have been exceptional as well. In the IB Diploma Programme, Aditya Agarwal with 45/45 IB points is a World Topper; 3 students scored 44/45; and 36% of the cohort scored above 40 points. In IGCSE, 3 students scored 10/10 A*, 1 student scored 9 A*, and 4 students scored 8 A*, with 66% of the class earning A* and A grades in all subjects.

These results are not just numbers; they are stories of perseverance, discipline, and the relentless pursuit of excellence by our young learners.

L & G, the ultimate measure of any schools journey lies in where their students go after they graduate from high school. And I am happy to let you know that this year again has been a hugely successful one as far as university placements are concerns.

On the national front, 12 students qualified the highly competitive NEET examination, earning admission to premier medical institutions such as AIIMS Rishikesh, SMS Medical College, and Vardhman Mahavir Medical College. 13 students cracked the JEE, gaining entry into IIT Delhi, IIT Kharagpur, and IIT Hyderabad, among others. 19 students cleared CLAT, joining India's top National Law Universities.

Our **in-house CUET preparation programme** ensured that students secured admissions into India's most prestigious colleges under Delhi University — including SRCC, Lady Shri Ram College, Miranda House, Hindu College, Kirori Mal, and Hans Raj.

Once again, our students have taken their place on the world stage with exceptional international university placements. They continue to earn admission to Ivy League and global universities with scholarships, becoming true ambassadors of our school.

We are immensely proud of Hitisha Goyal, admitted to Harvard University with a scholarship of over ₹2.6 crore; Pratyush Singhal at Columbia University; Shivam Narhari at Princeton University; Vasudha Rawat and Aditya Agarwal at Cornell University, with Aditya awarded a scholarship exceeding ₹2.4 crore; Daksh Jain at

Stanford; Jhankaar Purohit at the University of Chicago with a ₹3.39 crore scholarship; Linayesha Kumawat at NYU; and Chaarvi Bansal at UCLA.

Nandini Jaithalia joins Michigan State University with a ₹2.27 crore full scholarship; Anant Kasliwal is at University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign; Prisha at Purdue University; Aaradhya at University of Texas, Austin; Sambhav Dhandiya at Boston University; and Shuchita Ajmera and Khuman Patodiya at University of Washington, Seattle.

Beyond the US, Nirali Bhagat joins University of Melbourne; Madhhur Jain at IE Spain; Palishka Sonkiya at Sciences Po; Paarth Sonkiya and Aarjav Jain at NTU; Tvisha at NUS; Anvi Sacheti and Ada Jain at University of British Columbia, Canada; Yajvin Singhal at TU Delft; and Shaurya Chandra and Kushagra Jain at King's College London.

Saarthak Totuka, Jaivardhan, Hiten, and Arinjay Kuchhal won Silver Medals in U-17 and U-19 SGFI Tournaments. Karan Ladia was Runner-Up in the U-19 individual category and also won Silver in U-17 and U-19 team events.

In Tennis, Ojasvir Singh was the Winner in both Doubles and Singles at the National Tournament organised by the All-India Tennis Association. Arnav Sharma was selected for SGFI Nationals (U-19). Saumya Choudhary clinched the Singles and Doubles titles in the All-India Tennis Association Tournament and represented Team India at the national level. Janhavi Kajla won Gold at the SGFI Nationals and was selected for 'Khelo India'. Kavya Badaya, Tanushka Chopra, Divyanshi Rajoriya, Yashvi Jain, and Nirvi Poddar each won Gold in the SGFI U-14 District Tournament.

In Skating, Vanya Bohra won three Gold Medals in the CBSE Zonal U-17 Category, receiving the Best Player Trophy and selection for Nationals. She also bagged Gold at the CBSE West Zone Championship in Gujarat.

In Chess, Shreyanshi Jain is World No. 2 and India No. 1 in the U-6 Girls Category. Rudradaman Mertia finished 4th in U-15 at the State Tournament and qualified for Nationals. Vedanshi Gupta won Gold at the CBSE West Zone Tournament, while Ari-sha Agarwal, Shreya Poddar, Vedanshi Gupta, and Shreshtha Jain claimed Gold in CBSE West Zone U-14, advancing to the National Camp. Niti-sha Agrawal, Gehna Ajmera, Yash-i-ca Baheti, and Anushka Yadav secured Silver in the U-17 Category. Niti-sha, also won 1st place in the Open FIDE International Rated Chess Tournament, receiving ₹10,000 cash prize. Shreshtha Jain became Rajasthan U-15 State Champion and will represent Rajasthan in Nationals; she also won the U-13 Asian School Chess Tournament at Bangkok. Shivika Saraogi bagged Bronze at ISSO U-19 Nationals, and Tanvi Banura was Runners-Up at SGFI U-19 Nationals. Together, they led the team to distinction and earned Board Awards for individual excellence.

In Cricket, Kanishka Chauhan was selected for women U-19 State Challengers by the Rajasthan Cricket Association, while Devansh Singh Uppal represented the U-14 District and qualified for both U-14 and U-16 Challengers.

In Badminton, Harsh-ika Jain and Aaradhya Dhingra won Gold at the SGFI State Tournament, with Aaradhya qualifying for Nationals.

In Basketball, Risha Bargoti won Gold at the SGFI U-14 Nationals and serves as the Vice-Captain of the Rajasthan Team.

In Squash, Ayaan Kuchhal is ranked No. 13 in India by the Squash Racket Federation of India. Subhash Choudhary won Gold at the Uttarakhand U-19 Championship, while Ritwika Singh Bundela earned Bronze at the National Games.

In Gymnastics, Livi Grover secured All India Rank 3 at the CBSE National Gymnastics Competition.

Tanya Agarwal earned her Black Belt 1 Dan Diploma from the International Karate Federation of India.

In Shooting, Deetya Choudhary won 2 Gold and 1 Bronze Medal at the Pre-State Championship, while Swa-dha Nitin Kale qualified for the Pistol Shooting finals. Vihaan Singhvi and Neel Chaturvedi were selected for Pre-State SGFI U-14 and U-17, and Sanidhya Pathak bagged Silver in 10m Air Pistol Shooting at the Shree Bhanwar Singh Memorial Championship.

In Athletics, Aarnik Maheshwari won Gold and Bronze at the Serra International Racing and Relay Competition, while Anhad Arora secured first place in 100m and 200m races at the SFA Championship.

In Golf, Shiksha Jain was the 2nd Runner-Up at the Open Golf Championship held in Ahmedabad.

In Swimming, Aditya Sharma won nine medals at District and State-level competitions.

The Science Olympiad Foundation examination results have been equally remarkable. Students earned Gold Medals of Distinction and Excellence in IMO, NSO, IEO, and IGKO. More than 60 achieved Zonal Silver and Bronze Medals with cash awards, making their place among the country's brightest young minds.

In the **Silver Zone Olympiads**, Neerja Modi School students continued to excel, securing numerous **Medals of Excellence** — **Gold, Silver, and Bronze** in various subjects. Many of our students advanced to Level-2 and Level-3 rounds, with some achieving **Olympiad Topper distinctions** at the national level
